We are thrilled to share the highlights from our recent school residential trip to Calshot. The children had an incredible time engaging in a variety of activities, including **skiing**, **climbing**, **archery**, **air rifle shooting**, and **problem-solving challenges**. Many faced their fears and demonstrated remarkable resilience, which was truly inspiring to witness. They were fantastic ambassadors for the school and many instructors complimented the children's behaviour.

For those who remained at school, we organised an exciting programme of **forest school** activities. The children enjoyed building fires and cooking their own meals, fostering both teamwork and independence. They also had the exciting opportunity of helping Mrs Taylor build a poppy meadow ready for Remembrance Day on Tuesday.

Now that we are back, the children have caught up on their sleep and have settled back into school life. We have begun a new topic in maths: **fractions!** Our primary focus this week has been representing fractions pictorially, making the concepts more accessible. The children have also begun looking at comparing fractions by using their knowledge of equivalents.

In English, we have started our new learning journey with 'The Whale' by Ethan and Vita Murrow. A stimulating debate on animal wellbeing in zoos kicked off our discussions, sparking lots of insightful conversations. The children have generated tier 2 vocabulary in preparation for writing a **setting description**.

On Remembrance Day, the children enjoyed listening to diary entry from a WW1 soldier. The children were extremely reflective and were able to discuss appropriately what it must have been like for families at that time.

We look forward to continuing our hard work this school year, especially as we prepare for SATs.

Please consider how you may be able to help... there might be ways you can help that you don't realise:


